



Recycle This In Your Curbside Bins!

Blue Week: Paper, Cardboard and Glass Mixed Paper

- Computer paper
- Envelopes with windows or metal clasps
- Folders
- Junk mail
- Magazines and catalogs
- Newspaper
- Notebook paper
- Paper with staples or tape
- Phone books
- Post-its
- *Shredded paper
- Wrapping/tissue paper



*Shredded paper should be put in a paper bag, stapled shut and clearly marked.

Glass Containers

- All unbroken glass food and beverage containers; please rinse



Cardboard Boxes, Paperboard, Etc.

- Brown grocery sacks
- Cardboard boxes – flatten and place under the bin, no larger than 3' x 3'
- Paperboard – cereal, cake, cracker and snack boxes; frozen or refrigerated food boxes; Kleenex and cosmetic boxes; shoe, toy, game and gift boxes; paper and gift wrap rolls (place in the bin with your paper)



Green Week: Plastics and Metal

Plastic Containers and Cartons

- All #1 - #5 plastic containers that fit inside your recycling bin that are rinsed with lids removed
- Cartons – shelf-stable cartons and refrigerated milk cartons, juice boxes, etc.



Aluminum and Metal

- Aerosol cans
- All metal food and beverage containers
- Clean aluminum foil and trays
- Pie pans

Paper

- Absorbent paper (napkins, paper cups and plates, paper towels, tissues, etc.)
- Pet food bags

Glass

- Broken glass
- Glass dishes or glasses
- Light bulbs (incandescent only; fluorescent bulbs are accepted at the Household Hazardous Waste Center – see hours on page 20)
- Ceramic dishes
- Window glass

Plastics

- All #6 and #7 plastics – Styrofoam, Solo cups, etc.
- *Reuse plastic bags or recycle them inside area stores. Do not recycle plastic bags in curbside bins or drop-off containers.

Metal

- Bicycles
- Other scrap aluminum and steel can be taken to the Council Bluffs Recycling Center.
- Car rims
